

BREAST ARCHITECTURAL DISTORTION

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Identification of architectural distortion on mammography requires a well-trained radiologist. This distortion must be first distinguished from a false image resulting from the superposition of conjunctivo-glandular tractus by making additional views and spot compression. When traumatic and surgery history is eliminated, this mammography abnormality, is for the most part suggestive of malignant lesion and is classified in the 4th category of BIRADS classification of the American College of Radiology. It must be investigated by other techniques (sonography, MRI, percutaneous biopsy...) in order to define the best strategy for further management.
